In the survey, 90% of the people said they get good recommendations from their friends. About 40% get it from *Ratingzone*, about 42% get it from *Sleeper*, and 60% get it from *Amazon*. Which a separate survey showed the percent of trusted recommendation sources. Both movies and books trust using *Amazon* when choosing what to watch or read (Sinha and Swearingen 2006). Although, hearing about new books from friends is the best way. This means people like to help encourage each other to read having more of a learning experience by reading the book.

Movie statistic grossings show and prove that books are extremely popular. If they weren't popular, then authors wouldn't be making all this money. The popular book trilogy, *The Lord of the Rings*, made \$4.19 billion from all of the books and all of the movies only made \$2.9 billion. Another well known book series, *The Great Gatsby*, made a total of \$225 million. To go with the book series two movies were produced, one in 1974 and the other in 2013. Combined, the movies manufactured a total of \$165.4 million (Wiklund). There are also a lot of other books

out there that have made so much money it's crazy. For example, the popular book series written by John Green, *The Fault in Our Stars*, sold 5.7 million books just in 2014. That means he made a total of \$10.3 billion is just one year (Roxborough 2014). Another popular series, released in the year 2009 by James Dashner, *The Maze Runner*, grew in numbers. 2009 was the year the first book in the series was released. Just in five years of time the book itself sold over ten million copies. In 2014, Dashner said the series is starting to grow outside of the country. It is continuing to grow more popular (Dashner 2015). This is just a few of a thousand book series out there that have grow to become more popular each year.
